# Dual inverting Schmitt trigger with 5 V tolerant input Rev. 8 — 18 August 2023 Product data sheet

### 1. General description

The 74LVC2G14-Q100 is a dual inverter with Schmitt-trigger inputs. Inputs can be driven from either 3.3 V or 5 V devices. This feature allows the use of these devices as translators in mixed 3.3 V and 5 V environments.

This device is fully specified for partial power down applications using  $I_{OFF}$ . The  $I_{OFF}$  circuitry disables the output, preventing the potentially damaging backflow current through the device when it is powered down.

This product has been qualified to the Automotive Electronics Council (AEC) standard Q100 (Grade 1) and is suitable for use in automotive applications.













 $f_i$  = input frequency (MHz);


 $t_r$  = input rise time (ns); 10 % to 90 %;

 $t_f$  = input fall time (ns); 90 % to 10 %;

 $\Delta I_{CC(AV)}$  = average additional supply current ( $\mu A$ ).

 $\Delta I_{CC(AV)}$  differs with positive or negative input transitions, as shown in Fig. 9.


An example of a relaxation circuit using the 74LVC2G14-Q100 is shown in Fig. 10.

Fig. 9. Average I<sub>CC</sub> as a function of V<sub>CC</sub>






Fig. 11. Typical K-factor for relaxation oscillator




Fig. 12. Package outline SOT363-2 (TSSOP6)




Fig. 13. Package outline SOT457 (SC-74; TSOP6)




Fig. 14. Package outline SOT886 (XSON6)
