




Fig 1. Continuous drain current as a function of mounting base temperature

Fig 3. Single-shot and repetitive avalanche rating; avalanche current as a function of avalanche period




Fig 4. Safe operating area; continuous and peak drain currents as a function of drain-source voltage




Fig 5. Transient thermal impedance from junction to ambient as a function of pulse duration




Fig 6. Output characteristics: drain current as a function of drain-source voltage; typical values






Fig 8. Sub-threshold drain current as a function of gate-source voltage

Fig 9. Forward transconductance as a function of drain current; typical values




Fig 10. Transfer characteristics: drain current as a function of gate-source voltage; typical values






Fig 12. Drain-source on-state resistance as a function of drain current; typical values

Fig 13. Normalized drain-source on-state resistance factor as a function of junction temperature






Fig 14. Gate-source voltage as a function of gate charge; typical values

Fig 15. Input, output and reverse transfer capacitances as a function of drain-source voltage; typical values




