

Fig. 1. Power derating curves









Fig. 5. Base-emitter voltage as a function of collector current; typical values





Fig. 6. Base-emitter saturation voltage as a function of collector current; typical values








Fig. 9. Collector-emitter saturation voltage as a function of collector current; typical values





Fig. 10. Collector-emitter saturation resistance as a function of collector current; typical values


